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The following Safety Recommendations were issued as a result of the AAIA Aviation Accident Report derived from investigation file number A18-00004, a fatal accident which occurred on January 17, 2018, 4 miles south of Mastic Point settlement in Andros, Bahamas due to loss of control and aircraft contact with water. Safety recommendations were issued on 1<sup>st</sup> May, 2018 and final report published on 31<sup>st</sup> July, 2018.
